

Lexical Development Test Information 2012

Note: This information may change. Final details of the test are not yet finalised. この情報は変わるかもしれません。試験の最終的な詳細はまだ確定していません。

The lexical development test is for these reasons, where you: 語彙の発達試験の理由は下記の理由です。

- i. Learn new vocabulary. 新しい単語を学ぶ
- ii. Practice listening and recognising vocabulary. リスニングの練習及び単語の認識
- iii. Practice recognising vocabulary in sentences (in grammar). 文章中にある（文法）単語の認識の練習
- iv. Encourages students to use their textbook audio materials, and have more listening practice. 教科書のオーディオ教材を使い、更にリスニングの練習をするよう激励

The test uses a simple dictation format. Ten sentences, questions, or responses are read by the teacher. Students listen and write down the sentences. 試験は単純な書き取の形式です。講師が 10 の文章、質問文、回答文等を読みます。それを学生は聞き、書き取ります。
